The research, commisioned by **The Insurance Institute** and undertaken by **Empathy Research**, was conducted through an online survey across a nationally representative sample of 296 adults aged 18-34 and 345 parents of dependent children under the age of 18, with some crossover between the two groups, to compare attitudinal shifts towards perceptions of apprenticeships, as well as investigate considerations in relation to third level education and career choices.
