Purpose of the Non-major Panel:

The purpose of the non major panel was to validate a new module HLTH09015 and make the following change to insert it into the three programmes as listed above.

- 1. The Programme Committee proposes that the HLTH09009 Qualitative & Mixed Methods for Health Research module be moved to semester one to give students an introduction to research and a grounding in qualitative and mixed research methods in the context of health projects earlier in the programme.
- 2. The Programme Committee further proposes that the HLTH09010 Quantitative Methods for Health Research, be replaced by a new 5 credit module that focuses on applied quantitative methods relevant to the planning and evaluation of health projects. This new module HLTH09015 provides features of quantitative analysis aligned with the needs of health project management.
- 3. The Programme Committee proposes that the Applied Practices in Quantitative Methods (HLTH09015), 5ECTs module to be delivered in semester two for this programme after a grounding in mixed-methods in semester 1.
